

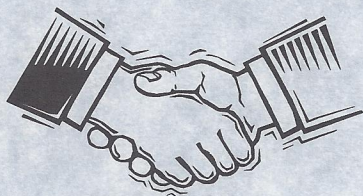

The St. Cloud Municipal Band was invited to China's capitol city, Beijing, to celebrate twenty years of normal relations with the United States. The theme of our concert event is "For Tomorrow . . . Peace, Friendship and Development". The high honor of this invitation was bestowed upon the band after a Chinese government official heard the band play in St. Cloud's Hester Park on July 4, 1998.

☞ The History of the Band

The existence of the band was reported in local newspapers as early as 1887 and its character has changed throughout its approximately 112 years of existence. In the late 1880's the band performed while riding bicycles and at one time (1927) the band of 233 members was called one of the largest bands in the world. For some time it included a beginners band, a boys band and an adult city band. The band has existed in its present form for over 50 years.

☞ The Band

Though the band is regularly sponsored by the City of St. Cloud, the trip to China was financed by the band members. The St. Cloud Municipal Band is a concert band of about 45 wind and percussion players. The mission of the band is to provide musical programming, entertainment and recreation to the citizens of St. Cloud. This is done by presenting a series of outdoor concerts in local parks as well as performing at area special events throughout the year.

☞ The Musicians

While most of the members of the band live in the city of St. Cloud, many of the musicians travel from their homes throughout central Minnesota to participate with the band. The common bond that brings the group together is the desire for musical expression and an opportunity to perform together with other adult musicians in this unique setting. Members of the band come from various occupations and include individuals from 18 to 83 years of age.

☞ The Conductors

The conductor for the China trip, Mel Hauck, is a retired music teacher and part-time professional musician. Before retiring in 1994, he had conducted public school bands in the State of Minnesota for 34 years. Mr. Hauck has also been involved with the St. Cloud Municipal Band, both as a tuba player and substitute conductor, since 1970. The full-time conductor of the band is Kathleen Johnson. Ms. Johnson is a music instructor at a local elementary school. Robert Wig, a retired music teacher, long time performer and conductor with the band, conducts his own composition, Wien Tügen.
