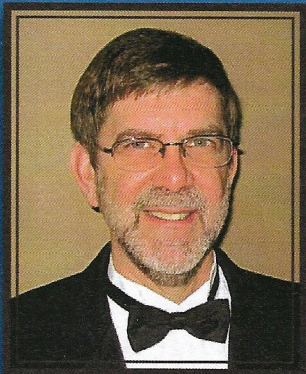


CATHARINE SINON BUSHMAN

Catharine is the Wind Ensemble Conductor and Assistant Professor of Music Education at St. Cloud State University. Previously, Dr. Bushman served on the faculty of Winthrop University where she led the Symphonic Band, taught graduate and undergraduate courses in music education, and supervised student interns. Dr. Bushman began her teaching career as Director of Bands at Crystal Lake Central High School in Crystal Lake, Illinois. She was an Assistant Director of Bands at Lassiter High School in Marietta, Georgia from 1998-2007.



Dr. Bushman received a DMA in Wind Conducting at The University of Texas at Austin in 2012. She holds degrees in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and Northwestern University. She maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor, adjudicator, and clinician for marching and concert bands. In 2009, she presented a clinic at the Texas Music Educators Conference, sharing her research on a successful band program in a disadvantaged southwest Texas community. Her academic interests include Igor Stravinsky's Symphonies of Wind Instruments, cultural issues in music education, and music teacher mentoring.



LOWELL LARSON

Lowell received a Bachelor of Science degree in music education from Bemidji State University in 1979. He taught instrumental music grades 5-12 in Royallton, MN for 7 years. He then moved to Annandale Public Schools in 1986 to teach classroom music, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade middle school bands, jazz band, and marching band at both the middle and high school levels. While at Annandale, he received his master's degree in music education from St. Cloud State University in 1989. He retired in 2013 after 27 years of teaching at Annandale.

Lowell's role in the St. Cloud Municipal Band has varied from playing euphonium and trombone, co-directing for 10 years, and serving as associate conductor since the fall of 2009. He had the privilege of conducting the band on its 2014 tour of Germany, Austria, and Italy.

He resides in the St. Cloud area with his wife and has three adult children with eight grandchildren.

HUGH GIVENS

Professor Givens joined the St. Cloud State University voice faculty in the fall of 1987. He received his undergraduate degree in Music Education from Glenville State College, his Masters in Vocal Pedagogy from West Virginia University and his Doctor of Music Arts in Performance and Literature also from WVU. Professor Givens has been teaching voice students, directing opera programs and conducting choirs and ensembles for over 25 years and remains devoted to the success of his students.

In addition to his teaching career, Givens has made concert appearances with many orchestras across the U.S. Most noted have been his performances of Verdi's "Requiem"; Beethoven's "Ninth Symphony"; Bach's "Missa Solemnis", "Christmas Oratorio" and "St. Matthew Passion"; and numerous performances of Handel's "Messiah". Regionally he has performed with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra and the Duluth Symphony. Givens has also performed with the Opera Company of Boston with Sarah Caldwell, Edmonton Opera, Virginia Lyric Opera, Minnesota Opera Company and the Lyric Opera of Kansas City. Givens has also several premieres to his credit including song cycles by Eric Kitchen and Bryan Hayes and the opera "From the Towers of the Moon" by Robert Moran.

Givens was the winner of the Bair Award from the National Opera Association in 1991. He also was the recipient of a role preparation grant from the William Matheus Sullivan Foundation from 1992-1997 and was a District Metropolitan Opera Competition Finalist in 1980.



DR. MARION JUDISH

Dr. Marion Judish is currently Professor of Violin and Viola at St. Cloud State University. She received her Doctorate of Musical Arts Degree from the University of Minnesota, and studied chamber music at the Juilliard School of Music. An avid performer, Marion has performed on Minnesota Public Radio, Thursday Musical, and in recital throughout Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Ohio, Wisconsin, Colorado, Wyoming, Chicago, New York City, the Great Britain, Sweden and the Netherlands. She performed the Oratorio "To Be Certain of the Dawn" by Stephen Paulus as concertmaster throughout Germany, Switzerland, and France. Marion is the concertmaster for the Wayzata Symphony, St. Cloud Symphony, and Amadeus Chamber Symphony. She is also the founding member and first violinist of the St. Cloud String Quartet.
